Directions

By Metro: Take the Green Line to the Anacostia Station. Exit the station on Howard Road. Walk to the corner, which is Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue, turn left, and walk three blocks to the Anacostia Professional Building.

By Bus: The Metrobus stops in front of Anacostia Professional Building (at the corner of Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue and V Street). Call WMATA at (202) 637-7000 for route information.

By Car: From the Courthouse, take Indiana Avenue toward 3rd Street and bear right into the 3rd Street Tunnel (395). Stay in the far left lane and merge onto 295 (Southeast/Southwest freeway). Take the Martin Luther King (MLK)/Anacostia exit. When you reach the traffic light on MLK, continue for approximately three blocks until you reach the Anacostia Professional Building on your right.
